RIBBS TAKES TOP HONORS IN G.I. JOE'S ROSE CUP BUDWEISER TRANS-AM

PORTLAND, Ore. -- The 1983 Trans-Am $_{\rm I\!R}$ is looking more and more like it really is the property of Budweiser.

The St. Louis brewer is the Trans-Am sponsor and also has a couple of Camaros which run the series.

The cars are prepared by Portland-based Neal DeAtley so when Willy T. Ribbs edged Greg Pickett for the top spot in Sunday's G.I. Joe's Rose Cup in Portland, it was reason for lots of celebrating in the Oregon city.

While Ribbs, who won his first-ever race by nipping Pickett by six-tenths of a second, was the center of attention, it sort of slid past unnoticed that the Budweiser/DeAtley team had just won its third-straight Trans-Am event. David Hobbs, who leads in the series points, took the other two victories in the last two races.

And the crowd of 20,502 got more than their money's worth as they watched a classic duel down the stretch of the 99.58 mile race.

Ribbs held and almost half-minute lead with 35 of the 52 laps down. But a crash involving Vern Smith's Capri forced the pace car onto the track and bunched the cars together for the exciting finish.

Ribbs held a lead of four seconds when the green came back out with 12 laps to go but Pickett kept nibbling away and, with four laps to go, found himself on Ribb's bumper. Pickett tried to pass for the lead on a number of occasions but Ribbs managed to hold him off. Pickett did briefly jump ahead when the yellow came back out on lap 49 after Monte Shelton suffered a heavy crash in his Porsche 911SC. But he let Ribbs back in the lead because he had passed under the yellow.

The race came down to the final corner and straight as the Camaro and Corvette made the right turn onto the front-stretch and Pickett looked for an opening but Ribbs slammed the door.

Ribbs averaged 89.50 mph en route to the victory. He earned \$8,350 of the over \$50,000 purse for his efforts.

Hobbs took the lead from polesitter Gene Felton at the outset and held on until lap 15 when a rear suspension problem forced him into the pits. He lost almost a lap while the trouble was rectified but managed to make the majority of that up while moving back to a fourth-place finish.

Tom Gloy finished third in the Lane Sports Racing Capri while Felton, who gained the pole in a rain-plagued session on Friday, was fifth.

The points battle tightened considerably and Hobbs leads Felton 68-49 with Gloy third with 46, Ribbs fourth at 42 and Pickett fifth with 41.

The series is back in action June 26 when it travels to Seattle International Raceway.
